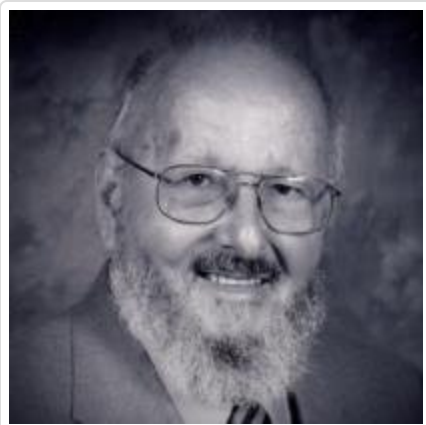




Allison E. Drown
