George Lee Clayville, 77, of Snow Hill, passed away peacefully Wednesday, March 26, 2014, at Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury. He was born in Indiantown on February 9, 1937, a son of the late George W. Clayville and Mary Virginia Shockley Clayville.

George Lee graduated from Snow Hill High School with the class of 1955. After graduation he began his lifelong devotion to farming.
