Snow Hill - Kenneth D. Brittingham, 78, of Snow Hill, died Thursday, March 14, 2013 at Peninsula Regional Medical Center in Salisbury.

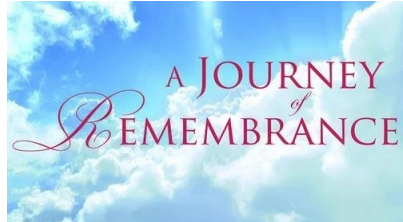
