MaryAnn "Molly" Henson, 68, of Laurel, passed away unexpectedly at her home on Thursday, August 27, 2015.

She was born on September 9, 1946 in Scranton, Pennsylvania, the daughter of Edward & Mary Griswold.

Molly was a 1964 graduate of Chenango Valley High School in New York. She began her career in 1966 for A.C. Spear Electric & Arrow Improvements, Inc. in Binghamton, NY before moving to the Eastern Shore of MD & DE in the 70's. 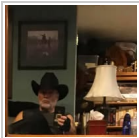
