“ My heart is so full of sadness and completely heartbroken right now. Just found out my long time friend of 30 years who was like a brother to me...passed away on Friday. When I was 18 and first diagnosed with bipolar disorder in North Arundel Hospital, I had nowhere to go when I was discharged because my family didn't want me with them. I ended up in Omni House in Glen Burnie where I met Bill or "Webster" as I always called him. He was always a great friend with a huge heart and we shared many laughs, played Nintendo, and pulled many shenanigans together. We continued to keep in touch, and he and his wife, Helen, was the first to contact me in the hospital when I had my psychotic break 5 years ago. I was trying to save up and go see him (he lived 3.5 hours away), but I was too late.
